

Leeds Choir hits the high notes in preparation for Paris tour

On Saturday 21st over 50 singers gathered at Holy Trinity Church, Meanwood, Leeds. The reason two fold; some for the love of singing Faure's Requiem and for others in preparation for the upcoming trip to Paris with the Heritage Masterworks Chorale.



Heritage Masterworks Chorale is a Leeds based choir, with the aim to bring the finest music to the finest venues. Today was a fantastic example of that – a very fine venue with famous choral music, but it was different in the fact that they were joined by their sister choir The Heritage Singers and many others singers from the surrounding areas and from as far afield as Sheffield and Birmingham.

The choir have gone from strength to strength over the last six years performing at many fine venues around Yorkshire, but they are also on a high from the very successful New York tour earlier this year.

The New York tour was the second time that the choir have travelled abroad and touring will now be an annual event in the schedule. The next trip scheduled later this year will be to Paris, where they will be performing Faure's Requiem in La Madeleine, the church for which it was written.
